**\*Immigrant Status (check if applicable)**  The Emergency Immigrant Education Program Public Law 103-382, Title VII, Part C requires school Districts (each charter school is its own district, separate from the local district) to report on the numbers of eligible immigrant children and youth enrolled. This information is necessary in order for the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education to determine eligibility of EIAP funds and are subject to audit by the federal government.
